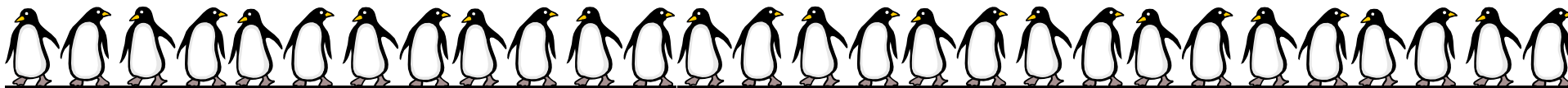

Changes in the Building

We've gone through some major renovations this summer. The bathrooms on the 1st and 3rd floors and the cafeteria have been completely renovated. Our cafeteria has more than doubled in size. The work on the addition is well underway and we hope to be able to occupy those rooms by January. Air conditioning was installed in the Media Center, Computer Lab and Office. Next summer we will complete the project by increasing the size of the 6 very small rooms on the 3rd floor. The PTO installed a new "jungle gym" on the front playground. 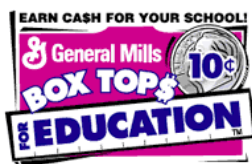
